1. What are some actions that can be implemented to improve the lives and welfare of farmed animals in industrial animal agriculture facilities?
2. It is often said that stronger welfare and environmental standards would cause an increase in costs to the industrial animal agriculture facilities. Do you think this extra cost should be put on the consumer, the farmers, or the industry/government? In addition, would you be willing to pay extra for food if the company had improved welfare and environmental standards?
3. Should communities near industrial animal agriculture facilities be compensated and if so, what is an appropriate way to compensate people for all the issues they create? Is there another way aside from nuisance suits?
4. What are some steps that industrial animal agriculture facilities can take to prevent wastewater from leaking into communities (whether it be through air or water) and mitigate the health issues they cause?
5. What are some changes that can be made to industrial animal agriculture facilities that benefit the farmed animals, the workers, and the communities around them all at once? In addition, how can the animal movement and the environmental movement work together to cure the injustices brought to the animals and communities?
6. With plant-based options gaining momentum, how do we ensure that we are creating a sustainable industry? In addition, how do we ensure that we are not exploiting communities near plant-based facilities and the workers within the industry in similar ways to industrial animal agriculture facilities?
7. What are some ways that we can hold corporations that own and run industrial animal agriculture facilities accountable? Should it be the consumers, the legislators, or the courts responsibility?
