

A Venerable Legal History

- King Canute, the 1018 Oxford Witan, & Written Law
- William the Conqueror & Forest Law

Pierson v. Post

- New York, 1802
 - Lodowick Post and friends chase fox
 - Jessie Pierson sees fox, kills fox, takes fox
- So, Who Has Property Interest in Fox?
- New York Supreme Court of Judicature
 - Court of luminaries:
 - Post's Attorney: Future NY Mayor
 - Pierson's Attorney: Future NY Chancellor
 - Judges: Future Fed Chief Justice;
 Future Fed VP; James Kent
- Is ownership achieved at the chase or the catch?
- Animals are Different
 - Particularly wildlife








Unpacking Legal Status of Wildlife

Property Status

- But what <u>Kind</u> of Property?
 - Proprietary Ownership vs Sovereign Ownership
 - Geer v. Connecticut (1896) vs Hughes v. Oklahoma (1979)
 - Public Trust Doctrine?
- Susceptible to Being Property, Anyway

- Research Subject
- Pest

- Endangered / Threatened







WHICH ANIMALS ARE WILDLIFE?

'Animals Living in The Wild'

- Animals Living w/o Human Support
 - But! Urban wildlife; captive wildlife

'Animals Who Act Wild'

- Animals Unaccustomed/III-Disposed to Human Interaction
 - But! Tame wildlife

'Genetically Wild Animals'

- Animals w/o selective breeding
 - But! Interbreeding

The Feral Animal Problem

e.g. Texas Feral Cat Cases







OF WILDLIFE & CRIMES

Types of Relevant Crimes

- Unhand The People's Duck: Resource Crimes
 - e.g. Poaching laws; hunting regs
- An Anti-Extinction Agenda: Environmental & Species Crimes
 - e.g. Endangered Species Act
- Predicate Required: Trafficking & Similar Crimes
 - e.g. Lacey Act
- The Animal's Experience: Cruelty Crimes
 - e.g. Neglect; abuse; fighting; etc.
- Why Not Both?: Cross-Over Category Crimes
 - e.g. Marine Mammal Protection Act 'take' provision








Non-Cruelty Crimes

Why Are These Crimes?

- Harms To…
 - ...Property
 - ...Utility
 - ... 'Commons'
- Malum In Se
 - Conduct which is a crime because inherently wrong
 - e.g. Anti-extinction crimes
- Malum Prohibitum
 - Conduct which is a crime because against rules
 - e.g. Hunting lawfully but for lack of license

Whose Interests Are Vindicated?

- State / Society
- Animals as Species







WHY CRUELTY CRIMES FOR WILDLIFE?

What Manner of Crime is Animal Cruelty?

- Malum In Se
 - Modern cruelty law is about animals on their own merits
 - See Oregon Trilogy: Fessenden; Nix; Newcomb
- Vindicates The Animal Victim's Interests
 - ...Interest in not being subject to cruelty at human hands

Else, Failure to Address Categorical Harms

Non-Cruelty Wildlife Crimes Do Not Capture All Relevant Conduct







A BRIEF ASIDE ON CRUELTY CRIMES

General Scope of Conduct


- Neglect
- Abuse
- Sexual Exploitation
- Animal Fighting

Jurisdiction

- State
- Federal
- Tribal

Common Relevant Exemptions

- Animal Husbandry
- Lawful Hunting
- Pests & Vermin
- Protection of Self / Others / Property
- Necessary / Justified Conduct
- Euthanasia







APPLYING CRUELTY LAW TO WILDLIFE

Generally

- No Generic 'But The Animal Was Wild' Defense
 - But! Potential complications re: pests / vermin

Acts of Omission: Neglect

- Sufficient Control Over Animal?
 - Implicates range of actors from individuals to commercial enterprise

Acts of Commission: Abuse

Applicable Exemption?

Sexual Exploitation

Unlikely to Be Serious Legal Hurdles

Animal Fighting

- Not All Animals Are Covered
- Disambiguating from Hunting







CRUELTY LAW & HUNTING

Legality of Hunting

- Generally, Is
 - In accord with licenses, season, bag limits, etc.

But Can Hunting Be Criminal Cruelty?

- Also, Yes
 - Lawful hunting ≠ any hunting method
 - Exemption may only apply to <u>lawful</u> hunts

Why Apply Cruelty Law to Unlawful Hunting?

- Certain Hunting Requirements Meant to Minimize Suffering
- Goes to Why Lawful Hunting is Not Cruelty
 - i.e. not because the animal's experience is harmless, but because society has deemed certain harms acceptable under specific circumstances.
