AN ABBREVIATED ANIMAL PROTECTION TIMELINE

Early On: Largely Animalsas Things

'Hey, that's my horse!'

Mid-1800s: Shift TowardsAnimals as Creatures

'IDK, seems like torture is a thing we should look out for'

Recent: Protecting Animalsfor Themselves

'Animals are sentient, & therefore should be shielded from cruelty'

Now: Okay, so...

...How Do We Do Protect Animals' Lives & Interests Effectively?







KEY FRAMEWORKS

Animal-Forward Lens

- An Animal-Forward Jurisprudence...
 - ...Surfaces animal experiences
 - …Recognizes these as cognizable & weighty
 - …Rejects animal/human zero-sum binary

Criminal Law; Criminal Justice

- What & Why
 - Not merely harmful (mala in se) / wrongful (mala prohibitam)
 - Not merely business of injured & injurer
- Vs Other Accountability Systems
 - E.g. tort law, civil fines









OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE GOALS & OUTCOMES

Denunciation	Restoration	Rehabilitation
Deterrence	Incapacitation	Retribution

- Statutory Sentence Range
 - Fines / Probation / Low Carceral Terms
 Some states have possession bans for some cruelty crimes
 - E.g. Washington Revised Code § 16.52.200(4)
 "Any person convicted of animal cruelty shall be prohibited from owning, caring for, possessing, or residing with any animals for a period of time as follows..." ← See tomorrow's Justice & Jurisprudence session
- In Practice?
 As Above, w/ Shift Towards Fine + Probation





The CHALLENGE

- Boosting Sentencing Effectiveness
 - 'Default' sentences are not one-size-fits-all
 - Particularly re:
 - Reduction of future risk (i.e. incapacitate; deter; rehab)
 - Animal victim's interest (i.e. restoration; denunciation)
- Exacerbated By:
 - Low granularity of animal crimes
 - Myth that animal crimes require exotic solutions
 - Knowledge gap





Targeting Response:

RISK; REMEDIATION; RESILIENCE

- Apply Animal-Forward Lens
 - Surfacing experience of animal victims
 - Inclining towards prevention & victim restoration
- Certify Legal & Mental Health / Social Work Professionals to...
 - 1) ...Apply risk assessments in cruelty cases connecting to sentences that
 - 2) ...Remediate harms suffered by animal victims
 - 3) ...Build resilience against future cruelty.









CASE STUDY EXAMPLE...

- Three Cases
 - Similar facts on the ground
 - Report of animal neglect at residence
 - 10 dogs
 - 1 dead (forensics indicates via starvation)
 - 2 w/ untreated infected injuries
 - 3 w/ severely underweight & parasite-ridden
 - 4 meet minimum standards for health
- Three Defendants: HH, MM, & VV
 - Each found guilty of agg neglect x1; neglect x5







HH's RESOLUTION...


Pre-Sentence Assessment

- Difficulty making effective care plans: self & animals.
- Deeply distressed re: separation from dogs.
- Family has attempted intervention multiple times in last 10y.
- Conduct characteristic of obsessive-compulsive disorders, suggesting possibly history of mental illness.
- Receptive to mental heath treatment & possession limits.

Sentence Proposals

- DA & Defense: 5 years probation, conditions include mental health treat & possess no more than 1 animal (per treatment recommendation)
- DA: Full cost of physical & behavior care for 5 neglected dogs; forfeiture of all dogs
- Defense: costs of physical care for 5 neglected dogs; forfeit all but 1.







MM's RESOLUTION...

Pre-Sentence Assessment

- Operated biz breeding 'specialty' dogs for last 10y.
- Historically complied with applicable law regulating dog-breeding.
- Sees dogs as an investment.
- Says neglected dogs undesirable for breeding →euthanize or give away.
 Dead dog "probably too old" to compete with others for food; "would have died anyway"
- No history indicative of mental health or substance-abuse issues.

Sentence Proposals

- DA: Full cost of physical & behavior care for 5 neglected dogs; forfeiture of all dogs; 5y probation; 10y ban on possessing more than 2 reproductively intact dogs.
- Defense: costs of physical care + forfeit for 5 neglected dogs; 5 year probation.





VV's RESOLUTION...

Pre-Sentence Assessment

- Controls finances etc. for spouse and minor child.
- Says neglected dogs belonged to spouse and child.
- Withheld food/funds for animal care when spouse and child failed to compliy with dictates.
- Argues state of the neglected dogs is not their responsibility.
- Has history of domestic violence.

Sentence Proposals

- DA: Full cost of physical & behavior care for 5 neglected dogs; 2 weeks incarceration; 4y probation; lifetime ban on possessing more than 1 dog (modifiable).
- Defense: costs of physical care + forfeit for 5 neglected dogs; 5 year probation.







FUTURE IMPLICATIONS

- Not a One-Shot, Silver Bullet Answer
- Self-Iterative
 - Gather data → refine assessments + outcomes → repeat
- Adapts as Contours of Animal Protection Laws Change
 - Positions animals as someones, not somethings
- Positioning re: Larger Crim Justice Conversations
 - Non-retributionist;
 pro-accountability




INDIVIDUALS CHARGED WITH INTENTIONAL CRUELTY ARE NOT ELIGIBLE










GEORGIA LAW – OCGA 17-10-7

(a) ... any person who, after having been convicted of a felony offense in this state or having been convicted under the laws of any other state ... shall be sentenced to undergo the longest period of time prescribed for the punishment of the subsequent offense of which he or she stands convicted, provided that, unless otherwise provided by law, the trial judge may, in his or her discretion, probate or suspend the maximum sentence prescribed for the offense.


(b)(2) ... any person who has been convicted of a serious violent felony in this state or who has been convicted under the laws of any other state ... who after such first conviction subsequently commits and is convicted of a serious violent felony ... shall be sentenced to imprisonment for life without parole...






GEORGIA LAW – OCGA 17-10-7

(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) or (b.1) of this Code section and subsection (b) of Code Section 42-9-45, any person who, after having been convicted under the laws of this state for three felonies or having been convicted under the laws of any other state or of the United States of three crimes which if committed within this state would be felonies, commits a felony within this state shall, upon conviction for such fourth offense or for subsequent offenses, serve the maximum time provided in the sentence of the judge based upon such conviction and shall not be eligible for parole until the maximum sentence has been served.



WHY DIVERT?




"The primary duty of a lawyer engaged in public prosecution is not to convict, but to see that justice is done."

HIGH RISK / HIGH NEED DEFENDANTS Men — Age 25+, Multiple Contacts w/ Justice System

- Defendants are referred by an ADA. Must be approved by a Supervisor (ME)
 - Cases can be referred by defense counsel or a defendant themselves, but must come through the unit
- Review is conducted including jail calls, police reports, conversation with the victim, conversation with relatives (when applicable)
- Defendant must have STABLE housing, access to public transportation or personal transportation. Defendant must agree to comply with any additional terms
- Bond order and "case hold" order is entered, releasing defendant to the street with strict conditions
 - We do not use ankle monitors
- Weekly reports are sent from the program on status
- Failures to comply are met with termination/incarceration or a "talking to" from the court.




How IT Works: 4 Cycles

- Most intensive
 Classes M Th, work w/ dogs,
 classes, job skills
- 2) Less IntensiveClasses every Friday, jobtraining, working w/ dogs
- Less Intensive
 Classes every Friday,
 employment, working w/ dogs
- 4) Least IntensiveClasses once a month,employment, working w/ dogs
